

Readings from Scripture

Gospel Reading – John 20:19-31

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Authorities, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Sovereign. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As Abba has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Holy One." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Sovereign and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Child of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

SACRED RECKONINGS ADULT ED. CLASS TODAY! We hope you can join us today (April 7) after worship for the first of two hybrid (in-person and on Zoom) Adult Education classes, after church today and next Sunday, April 14, to learn about a justice-focused project designed for churches. Sacred Reckonings calls us to the deep spiritual work of reckoning with the histories of colonization and White supremacy, and beginning the work of repair. "It also calls us to the promise of liberation that is woven into the work of reckoning." Last fall, Rev. Rob sent an open invitation to participate in a Sacred Reckonings remote training. Six people from Covenant attended. It was a powerful training and we haven't stopped learning since. We hope you can come, whether to one or both classes.
