### Hebrew Bible Reading – Exodus 20:18-22

When all the people witnessed the thunder and lightning, the sound of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking, they were afraid and trembled and stood at a distance and said to Moses, “You speak to us, and we will listen, but do not let God speak to us, lest we die.” Moses said to the people, “Do not be afraid, for God has come only to test you and to put the fear of God upon you so that you do not sin.” Then the people stood at a distance, while Moses drew near to the thick darkness where God was.

**A NOTE ON THE OFFERTORY:** Olivier Messiaen's *Meditations on the Mysteries of the Holy Trinity* is a massive work of nine movements, lasting approximately one hour. Composed in 1969, the work features a highly developed language of symbols including Gregorian chant, rhythmic patterns from classical Indian music, representative motives in the style of Wagner, birdsong, and even an invented musical alphabet. Messiaen's goal was lofty: to communicate in the language of angels. The score of "Meditation 8" is filled with extra-musical information that will be projected during this morning's Offertory. The unifying message is symbolized by an unaccompanied Gregorian Chant representing the simplicity of God.
