Readings from Scripture

Hebrew Bible Reading – 1 Samuel 20:11-17

Jonathan replied to David, "Come, let us go out into the field." So, they both went out into the field.

Jonathan said to David, "By the Lord, the God of Israel! When I have sounded out my father, about this time tomorrow or on the third day, if he is well disposed toward David, shall I not then send and disclose it to you? But if my father intends to do you harm, God do so to Jonathan and more also, if I do not disclose it to you and send you away, so that you may go in safety. May God be with you, as God has been with my father. If I am still alive, show me the faithful love of God, but if I die, never cut off your faithful love from my house, even if God were to cut off every one of the enemies of David from the face of the earth."

Thus, Jonathan made a covenant with the house of David, saying, "May God seek out the enemies of David." Jonathan made David swear again by his love for him, for he loved him as he loved his own life.

New Testament Reading – Colossians 1:15-23 (*The Message* translation) We look at this Son and see the God who cannot be seen. We look at this Son and see God's original purpose in everything created. For everything, absolutely everything, above and below, visible and invisible, rank after rank after rank of angels—*everything* got started in him and finds its purpose in him. He was there before any of it came into existence and holds it all together right up to this moment. And when it comes to the church, he organizes and holds it together, like a head does a body.

He was supreme in the beginning and—leading the resurrection parade—he is supreme in the end. From beginning to end he's there, towering far above everything, everyone. So spacious is he, so expansive, that everything of God finds its proper place in him without crowding. Not only that, but all the broken and dislocated pieces of the universe—people and things, animals and atoms—get properly fixed and fit together in vibrant harmonies, all because of his death, his blood that poured down from the cross.
